How is the Pupil Survey carried out?

To answer the Pupil Survey is voluntary, but we hope you will participate in order to make the school better.

You can skip questions you do not wish to answer.

We take good care of your answers

When you answer the questions in the Pupil Survey you will not be asked to write your name anywhere. Neither the school, nor the municipality or the national authorities will see your answers. The Norwegian Directorate for Education and Training is responsible for keeping and using your answers to the Pupil Survey correctly.

What is the purpose?

The purpose of the Directorate for Education and Training's Teacher Survey is to allow teachers to voice their opinion about learning and well-being at school. The results from the user survey will not be deleted, but will be kept securely and be used by schools, municipalities and national authorities as a help to analyse and develop the learning environment. Data from the survey may be used for research purposes. Parts of the results from the Pupil Survey will be published on the School Portal.

How is the survey carried out?

The Teacher Survey can be carried out both in the spring and fall semesters.

Responding to the Teacher Survey is voluntary. You do not have to answer the survey.

You can choose to skip a question, should it make you feel uncomfortable, or if there is a question you do not wish to answer.

Data control and data protection
